Old Man of Hoy

The name 'Hoy' comes from the Norse meaning 'high island', and from almost any part of Mainland Orkney the dramatic difference in landscape is evident, with two high hills to the south and a deep glen in between. The high sandstone cliffs of Hoy and the sea stack of the Old Man have been a popular destination for visitors since Victorian times.


Note The summer 10:15 ferry from Houton to Lyness, returning at 16:40, gives ample time to complete the walk, which begins with a 40-minute drive from Lyness to Rackwick. En route, if time allows, it is possible to take a short walk to the Dwarfie Stane (HY 243 004) or the poignant grave of Betty Corrigall (ND 280 997).

 The walk starts from the car park by following the track (signed for the Old Man of Hoy) towards a group of cottages and soon crossing a cattle grid, beyond which it continues as a broad track. Follow the track as it curves right and strikes inland, now climbing gently. When it bends left, at a three-way junction of tracks, continue straight on as far as a signed path cutting back acutely at a rock sign for the Old Man .




Craa's Nest Museum

The low-lying turf-roof buildings here are the Craa's Nest Museum, which has displays about the heritage of the village and Hoy and are worth a visit on your way back.



Having left the broad track, a grassy path now ensues, climbing to and past one final building eventually to arrive at a kissing-gate giving on to the RSPB Hoy Nature Reserve. The path continues beyond, rising steadily onto the open hillside with excellent retrospective views of the sandy beach at Rackwick Bay.



from it, heading back towards the Lochs of Dridgeo, keeping them to your right as you head south back to Calder's Geo. The lighthouse here is not the most attractive, but, built between 1925 and

1929 by David Alan Stevenson, it remains in use, albeit automated.

and so conclude a brief visit. But from the gate, the main route bears right above low sea cliffs to a gate and then across rough ground to a step-stile **B**.

The exact nature of the ongoing route is what you make of it; intermittent sheep tracks, boardwalks, stiles and gates lead round the Wick, passing the small headland of Brim Ness and finally pressing on to climb gently to a coastguard lookout station **C** on Gloup Ness. But on a fine day, it is nothing short of a delightful if rugged amble above increasingly impressive sea cliffs.

Remembrance

The Gloup Fishing Disaster occurred in 1881, in which 58 fishermen were killed by an unexpected summer storm coming from the direction of Iceland. The memorial was erected 100 years later and depicts a mother and child gazing out to sea searching for the return of their loved ones.



